Failure of equipment	Users	1	1	1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>None of the various Giant Games have significant risk of causing injuries</li> <li>Check wooden equipment for rough edges &amp; risk of splinters.</li> <li>Any damage should be reported to the Duty Manager &amp; the equipment should not be used until inspected, repaired &amp; deemed safe</li> <li>All equipment has a detailed inspection quarterly &amp; results logged</li> </ul>	1	1	1	
First Aid required	Staff, users, other site users	1	1	1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Group is responsible for having their own First Aid kit</li> <li>All staff on site are first aid trained and large First Aid kits are available at Reception, Providore &amp; Crew Hut</li> <li>All staff aware of site emergency plan and carry a site radio</li> </ul>	1	1	1

					<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Take care of falling Jenga pieces &amp; do not sit next to tower. Towers should not exceed 1 metre high</li> <li>• Injuries may occur if objects, e.g. the wooden dice, are thrown around so behaviour should be monitored</li> </ul>

Injury from lifting and carrying equipment	Staff & Users	1	1	1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Most of the Giant Games equipment is light weight except the Giant Jenga blocks when in their storage container</li> <li>• Take care &amp; using good lifting technique when moving the blocks &amp; consider using a trolley</li> </ul>	1	1	1

Trips	Staff & users	2	2	4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Giant Games can be setup in most places on the campsite or in buildings, so ensure obvious trip hazards are removed as far as reasonably possible in a woodland environment</li> <li>• Ensure Giant Games equipment used is kept tidy</li> </ul>	1	2	2
